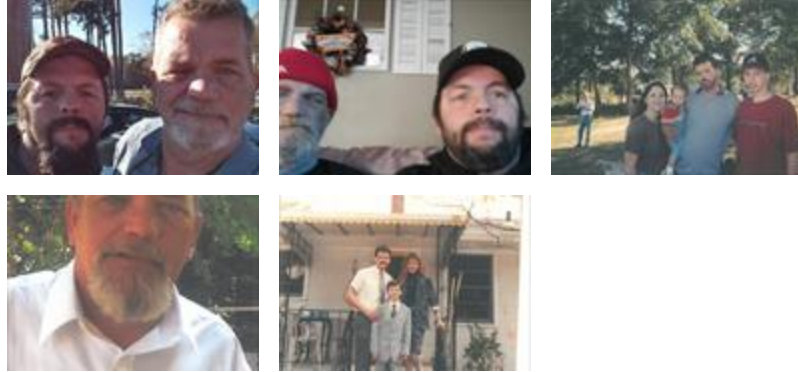
As per Raymond's request he is being Cremated and there will be No Funeral Service but a "Celebration of Life" gathering will take place at a later date yet to be determined.
